

TOP 10 REASONS TO JOIN IRTA

- 1. Serves as a "watchdog" on the state legislature and monitors the progress, or lack of, on those bills that directly affect retired teachers by defending pension and healthcare protection via its lobbying efforts, and advocating for retirees.
- 2. Represented in the General Assembly by the Executive Director and a lobbyist.
- 3. Offers a wide range of member benefits by providing group rate dental and vision insurance among other benefits, and providing travel and entertainment options for its members.
- 4. Makes available the services and vast resources of the IRTA office in Springfield: research, data, statistics, and information.
- 5. Keeps members topically informed through the IRTA's Action Bulletin.
- 6. Offers financial assistance through the IRTA Foundation.
- 7. Allows access to a password-protected website (www.irtaonline.org).
- 8. Puts members in direct contact with other retired teachers through the 93 local Units throughout the state of Illinois.
- 9. Keeps members up-to-date and well-informed through its website: www.irtaonline.org
- 10. Allows for instantaneous messaging to your legislators on issues that affect teachers through the use of Voter Voice.



In 1985, after identifying a large number of former educators who were experiencing financial difficulties because of low pensions and inflation, the IRTA established the IRTA Foundation, Inc., the initial purpose being to create an endowment providing assistance to retired educators. Since that time, **Foundation supports the following from the** *past, present, and the future* (Wendy Wiegers is Area 2's Foundation representative):

- Continues to provide <u>financial assistance to retired educators</u> who are living in times of acute financial stress. <u>If you or anyone you know is having difficulties meeting financial obligations</u>, please submit a financial assistance form to IRTAF, 828 S. 2nd Street, Springfield, IL 62704, for consideration. All information is *confidential*.
- Makes <u>\$36,500 in grant money</u> available statewide in Illinois to provide special funds (up to \$750) to public school educators (Pre-K through 12) so that their students will have the means to participate in special projects. A special committee will select the recipients of the grant money over the summer. Grant awards will be presented in the fall. All proposals must be submitted by June 1, 2019.
- 3. <u>Awards six (one from each Area)</u> <u>\$1,500 scholarships</u> to incoming juniors or seniors in college that are pursuing a *degree in education*. All applications must be submitted by March 7, 2019.

One scholarship of \$1500 will be awarded in the spring to a Lake County high school senior to recognize ability and achievement, contribution to the community, and a desire to pursue a career in education. 2. 3. Organizations depend on the three "M's" for their existence: "Membership, Money, and Momentum."

- <u>Membership</u>: No organization can exist without a body of dedicated members who can be relied upon to carry out the mission and business of the group. Maintaining a minimum "base" membership, therefore, is a prerequisite for maintaining the group's health and continued influence. As older members either expire or relocate, the task, therefore, is to recruit new blood from the ranks of newly retired teachers—a task that is particularly difficult because **lists of retiring teachers are jealously guarded hence difficult to come by**.
- <u>Money</u>: Obviously dues are charged to support the organization for postage, speakers' fees, scholarships, awards, prizes, printing costs, etc.
- <u>Momentum</u>: It's probably a factor in most organizations that as the business of the group is "settled in" and running smoothly (momentum), complacency creeps in, and the high-level of productivity inevitably begins to taper off. The membership leaders need to encourage members for their efforts and contributions—and continue to seek new idea and approaches.

4. This past February 1st (2019), when all of us over 61 got a compounded 3% increase from TRS, let's **remember that it was your IRTA that brought the lawsuit that made that possible**: **Doris Heaton v. Pat Quinn: "Crisis is no excuse to violate the Constitution.**" The IRTA's own Doris Heaton and Pamela Keller were plaintiffs in this challenge to Senate Bill 1 which would have reduced automatic annuity increases (AAIs), placed caps on pensionable salaries, increased the retirement age, and made other changes that diminished pensions. <u>The Court unanimously ruled that Senate Bill 1 was unconstitutional!</u>

5. Become involved! Elections for officers (President, Vice President, Associate Vice President, and Secretary) for 2020 will be at the Fall Luncheon, October 8th.
